PASTORS CORNER

Hello First UMC Family,

So summer is here and holy smokes has it been a hot one so far. As I look out my office window I see an entire neighborhood of brown grass. I was walking down to the sign in the front of the church to post about vacation bible school and the grass was crunching under my feet. Let's pray for some rain so that the thirsty grass can know life again.

As I walked through the thirsty grass, I was reminded of the thirsty rich man in *Luke 16:19-24*. Jesus said, "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and lived in luxury every day. ²⁰ At his gate was laid a beggar named Lazarus, covered with sores ²¹ and longing to eat what fell from the rich man's table. Even the dogs came and licked his sores. ²² "The time came when the beggar died and the angels carried him to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried. ²³ In Hades, where he was in torment, he looked up and saw Abraham far away, with Lazarus by his side. ²⁴ So he called to him, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this fire.'

The text indicates that the rich man went to Hell when he died. But Lazarus, the beggar went to Heaven. And what is important to notice is that Lazarus was outside the rich man's gate and yet the rich man did not help. His selfishness and greed earn his reward in Hell. Later the rich man begged to have Lazarus give him a drop of water from his finger. But there was no reprieve from his thirst in hell.

As we look at these texts, we need to be reminded that whether we go to Heaven or Hell is entirely up to Jesus. But even though it is solely Jesus' decision, our actions matter. The rich man made his choices here on earth and he ended up dead and thirsty. And we should not be so foolish as to think that we are exempt from the same fate.

Let the dead, thirsty grass in our neighborhoods serve as a reminder to obey our God. The Lord brings the rain that gives life to the grass. Just as the Lord brings the believer an everlasting well of living water. Follow the Lord because our actions matter...
